## ANNOUNCEMENT

The British Society for Proteome Research is pleased to announce that it will be offering two Fellowships for early-stage PhD students and early-stage post-doctoral researchers to attend an intensive 5-day practical course in proteomics. The course is called “The 3rd European Summer School in Proteomic Basics: Quantification and Post-translational Modifications of Proteins“. It will take place from 2<sup>nd</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup> August 2009 at Kloster Neustift (Brixen/Bressanone, South Tyrol, Italy). The summer school is designed to provide an insight into the state-of-the-art protein analytic techniques in quantification of proteins and the detection of their post-translational modifications for graduate students and young post doctoral workers.

The course is being taught by a selection of internationally renowned proteomics researchers and will represent an excellent opportunity for young researchers to gain experience of Proteomics.
